#### **CURRENT COVID-19 NUMBERS**

With winter and flu season upon us – the College will provide the most current numbers (includes Toledo and Youngstown), noting that the numbers change frequently. As of November 22, 2020, 105 students are in COVID protocol with 19 COVID + under the direction of Jennifer Barber, college health nurse.

Since March 2020, there have been 53 COVID+ students with 34 approved to return to campus.

# Toledo Directions for Entry

Enter Jefferson side of the building (grocery store type doors) with your face covering in place. Face coverings must **always** be worn while on campus unless alone in in a private office.

During peak times (early morning) there will be a second temperature station for faculty/staff/students if entering from under the blue canopy. If no one is present at the second station, please proceed to the temperature check station at the (grocery store door) entrance.

# Temperature check is with a non-contact thermometer. Temperature must be less than 100 degrees (F). If temperature is 100 degrees or higher you will not be permitted

Please stand at least <u>six</u> feet from others if anyone is waiting for their temperature to be taken.

Please use good hand hygiene and/or hand sanitizer. Hand sanitizer stations are on walls and will be placed in classrooms and labs.

Anyone not following the guidelines will be subject to the Student Code of Conduct, and employees will be subject to Mercy Health HR guidelines.

Cleaning supplies will be provided in all rooms – please clean work/study area before and after finishing work/student, etc.

Verasure and Virex wipes must dry for 10 minutes to be effective

Rad Tech students will follow **purple** circles to their destination.

Science Lab students will follow Yellow circles to their destination.

#### **EMT/Paramedic students**

follow **<u>orange</u>** circles to their destination.

<u>BLS students</u> follow <u>red</u> circles to their destination.

Phlebotomy students follow **black** circles to their destination.

**Nursing students** follow

**green** circles to their destination if on Jefferson second or third floor and

follow **blue** circles to their destination if on Madison second, third, or fourth floor.




# SAFETY FIRST



#### YOUNGSTOWN DIRECTIONS FOR ENTRY

All Youngstown students are to enter the building through the rear door (from the Cardiac Health Center parking lot).

If using the stairwell going up, please stay at least <u>six</u> feet away from other students.

If you are going to the Skills Lab on second floor, exit the stairwell at the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor and proceed directly to the Skills Lab; your temperature will be taken by the Skills Lab Coordinator.

If you are going to the fourth floor Administrative Offices, take stairs to the 4<sup>th</sup> floor and exit the stairwell at the 4<sup>th</sup> floor and proceed directly to either Darnell LaRosa or Tina Fowler's office. They will take your temperature.

You may also proceed to your destination using the elevator, only <u>TWO</u> students at a time in the elevator.

Please stand at least <u>six</u> feet away from others if anyone is waiting for their temperature to be taken.

If your temperature is 100 degrees or higher, you will not be permitted to stay in the building; you should monitor for further COVID symptoms and contact your Primary Care Provider (PCP).

#### REVISED COLLEGE HOURS BEGINNING NOVEMBER 16, 2020 both in TOLEDO AND YOUNGSTOWN

Due to the increasing numbers of students and faculty/staff who are in the Mercy College travel and exposure protocol led by our student health nurse Jennifer Barber, and our Incident Commander, Marc Adkins, the following plan of action is being implemented to continue to meet the needs of our students and faculty/staff with regard to everyone's safety and well-being.

Effective Wednesday November 18, 2020 all classes will be moved to the virtual/remote/digital-mediated learning environment. *Tuesday, November 17, 2020 will be the last day of on-campus activities unless you have an ATI, HESI or other scheduled examination.* The rooms in which these exams take place should be staged appropriately with all students socially distanced and wearing masks. Hand sanitizer and wipes should be used to clean all computer/desk stations before and after exams.

The nursing skills lab/simulation area will be open <u>ONLY</u> for students who need to practice and complete their skills check offs. All practice and check off appointments <u>must be one-on-one</u>.

All Clinical/preceptor activities will continue as scheduled.

<u>Faculty/staff members will send any changes or updates to students, and if you have questions, please</u> reach out to your faculty/staff member.

<u>The week of November 23, 2020, the College is only open two days</u>: Monday, November 23, 2020 and Tuesday, November 24, 2020 from 10am-3pm for <u>URGENT</u> situations only and as noted above for testing and skills lab appointments.

<u>The week of November 30-December 4, 2020</u>, the College is open Monday-Friday from 10am-3pm for <u>URGENT</u> situations only and students may use the Jefferson sixth floor to study and to print as needed. This week will also be used for any on-campus activity that is considered make-up work. Your faculty member will provide instructions if this applies to you or your course.

The remaining weeks of the semester from December 7, 2020 through December 17, 2020, the College will be open minimal hours due to the increasing COVID numbers. The hours will be Monday, Wednesday, and Friday from 10am-2pm. Students, faculty and staff should only be on campus for <u>URGENT</u> situations. <u>Jefferson 6<sup>th</sup> floor</u> will be the point of entry for students who need to study in the cubicles, use the computers, print papers, etc.

The College will be open with faculty/staff working remotely from Friday, December 18, 2020 through Monday, January 4, 2021.

**Youngstown** will follow the same schedule as Toledo. Students will continue to follow the same guidelines for entering the Youngstown location. Please follow any instructions provided by faculty/staff.

<u>Thank you</u> for all you have done to keep the College a safe place during the last 13 weeks! We thank you also for being flexible as we move forward with the remaining weeks of the semester and into the new year!! We continue to be agile, dedicated and Mercy Strong!

As you prepare for the holidays, we ask that you continue to think of the health and well-being of your families and friends, your Mercy student colleagues, and Mercy College faculty/staff, and above all please remember to take care of yourself. This will be a difficult and challenging holiday season and we want to keep everyone safe and healthy. Many blessings to all as we enter the holiday season.

FALL COMMENCEMENT (Decision coming December 7, 2020) – Be prepared to move to Option 2 or Option 3 given the current situation.

Commencement at Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral or at the Basilica of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Reception Hall (Option 1)

The commencement ceremony in Toledo is scheduled to be held on Thursday, Dec 17, 2020 at Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral and the Youngstown ceremony is scheduled to be held on Friday, Dec 18, 2020 at 6:00pm at The Basilica of Our Lady of Mount Carmel Reception Hall. All 2020 graduates have been invited to participate in the celebration, which includes the following outreach (email, text messages and phone calls) to May and August graduates, and the December candidates for graduation.

Due to health and safety concerns, commencement ceremonies will look very different. The processional and recessional are prohibited by the Cathedral and the Reception Hall. Also, we will have a soloist who will sing our hymns, and all other participants will be asked <u>not to sing</u> to reduce the aerosol spread. Each ceremony will also have a student speaker in lieu of both a commencement speaker and a student speaker.

Only those students who have RSVP'd are eligible to participate.

#### **MERCY NEWS**

The safety of everyone is of utmost importance to Mercy College! Please do not attend if you have any symptoms of the coronavirus or the flu/cold.

Graduates will be permitted to bring three guests to the Cathedral or to the Reception Hall, and face coverings that cover both the nose and mouth must be worn at all times while in the venues and all social distancing guidelines will be enforced. Since guests will be limited and most of the Mercy College community will not be attending, we are exploring live stream options in both Toledo and Youngstown. We ask that only children who can wear a face mask for the duration of the ceremony (one hour) attend. It is preferred that guests accompanying the graduates are adults. There will be two ceremonies in Toledo:

- Ceremony one will be from 1-2 p.m. for Associate and Certificate graduates and candidates for graduation.
- Ceremony two will be from 4-5 p.m. for Bachelors and Masters graduates and candidates for graduation.

Contingent upon health and safety conditions in each location on Monday, December 7, 2020 a final decision will be made by college administration along with incident command regarding the ceremony outlined in Option 1 or to move to Option 2 or 3.

#### Virtual Ceremony in Toledo and/or Youngstown (Option 3)

Option 3 will be used only if the State of Ohio is operating under a stay-at-home order.
