The Toledo campus graduation ceremony took place on Friday, May 7 at Our Lady, Queen of the Most Holy Rosary Cathedral. The Youngstown campus graduation ceremony took place on Monday, May 10 at St. Columba Cathedral. Though graduating in a time of uncertainty, our graduates have proven diligence and perseverance. All covid-19 safety and social distancing precautions were followed for commencement.

Remember When?

In August 1967, Mercy nursing students were expected to report to class with their Mercy cap, lab coat, pin, shoes, mug, and lamp (pictured here). Students were expected to report to their clinical experiences on time, greet the head nurse, and conduct their daily assignments of stripping the beds, changing bed linens, bathing patients, caring for hair and

nails, and attending to the environment. They observed symptoms continuously and measured all eliminations and records. They were responsible for managing patients' diets, symptoms, treatments, doctor visits, and activities. At the end of each shift, Mercy nursing students reported off to the head nurse, team leader (if any), and clinical instructor giving a summary of the patient's morning.

Class of 1970 graduate Julie Stover-Lauer shares that she remembers "the exposure to new friends, experiences, personalities, and discovering of (her)self... and just being a Mercy Nurse! I think we're the best! There are so many things that I remember. It is just a nostalgic feeling to try to recollect all of those previous memories."



Alumni Spotlight – Alisha Fata

An educated community is one of the best combatants towards heart disease, a health risk sending millions of Americans to the ER every year. The trend is only growing as heart disease continues to rise.

Mercy Health Clinical Educator and Mercy College of Ohio graduate Alisha Fata created and launched an event called COPE, to educate the Youngstown community on the issue of heart failure.

It was during her schooling at Mercy College Alisha was posed with the question of how to improve patient outcomes at her facility, Mercy Health – St. Elizabeth Boardman. When realizing the high readmission rate for heart failure patients, she went to work on finding a solution.

"My current role was designed in conjunction with the hospital's goal to decrease heart failure readmissions," she said.

She began work on COPE or Cardiovascular Outpatient Program & Education, to help keep heart failure patients up to date on education, resources, ask questions and get involved with other healthy initiatives to increase cardiac health. "Hearing patients say how much it meant to them that they were invited to the event, even if they didn't have heart failure, whether it was their parents or their significant other of someone that meant the world to me," she said.

Alisha credits her education at Mercy College as being instrumental in helping her to form COPE, she reflected. "It gave me the confidence to know that I can implement something as big as this and impact our local communities in a positive way."
