Community Engagement Highlight

Youngstown Campus



Faculty Members Annette Hinrichs and Shannon Murphy used their Mercy College service awards to fund a summer service learning project with their NUR 123 courses during the Summer 2019 term. They partnered with Rescue Mission of Mahoning Valley which provides services and meals to people experiencing homelessness. Groups of students were given a topic regarding the physical & mental health needs related to homelessness and they designed a mini health station on that topic. The day of the project, students went to

the Rescue Mission with their instructor, set up their station, and interacted with clients during their meal service. They created an educational party for 100 clients (including 30 children). Faculty staff, and students also raised money to help move the Rescue Mission into a better building. They sold T shirts, did a basket raffle, and got donations from all over the community. Over \$1000 was raised for the Rescue Mission!


